SPORTS PREMIUM 2017-18 IMPACT

Background

In order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools the government is providing additional funding for primary school sport. This funding is given directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium Funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

Allocation

For the academic year 2017 -18 received an amount of £16,780 sports premium.

Impact

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| 1. To improve PE facilities at school. | £ 10000 | Due to extensive school refurbishment it has not been possible to do KS1 and KS2 outside play areas. Money spent on Cushioned pillars and fencing in play areas - £4000. Some of money is reserved for carry forward projects £6000 in next academic year funding. | As a result of using Sports Premium effectively our provision has improved the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision. All students in our sport premium cohort benefited from additional funding regardless of their sporting / physical abilities. The development of lunch time clubs, included an increased participation in PE and sport and leisure so that all pupils have developed healthy lifestyles and reached the performance levels they are capable of. As a result of purchasing specialist PE equipment the students have developed their physical skills being able to grow in confidence and take pride in their achievements. According to our progress data our students are making good progress in all areas of the curriculum. Due to staff training we have been able to maintain high quality PE provision and extend our PE offer. |
| 2. To provide the students with a wide range of sports activities in school | £ 2780 | The students have been able to access lunchtime clubs including Watford Football Club and a multi-skills club. On two days the school hired bouncy castles for the whole day in the sports hall and all classes had a time allocation. One class has experienced Boxercise sessions in their lesson as part of trying new sports. | |
| 3. To provide the students with a wide range of sports activities in the community | £ 2000 | All classes went on a Summer term school outing that had a physical / sporting emphasis ranging from riding the bicycles around Stanborough lakes to attending a theme park. KS1 students went weekly to horse riding at Gaddesden Stables. Students participated in festivals and games set up by the SLD PE Coordinators. | |
