SPORTS PREMIUM 2014-15

Background

The Government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils (as reported in the 2014 school census) will receive the funding.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can **only** be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. All school will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium funding to support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport.

Allocation

For the academic year Sept 2014 – August 2015 we expect to receive an amount of **£8175**.

Rationale

Our rationale for the use of Sports Premium funding, which the Governors have agreed, are that it must be used so that:

- All students benefit regardless of their sporting / physical abilities
- Most students are given opportunities to compete in tournaments with other schools
- Staff have access to training opportunities and CPD
- Some activities may be subsidised so that the students do not miss out due to financial constraints
- Use of collaborative and partnership working

Usage

With the above rationale in mind and following the guidelines of how to spend this money, our initial plan for the use of the funding include;

1. Develop our outdoor play area to enrich the PE environment for our Primary students
 - £ 2600 for refurbishing Lower Playground (£30 000 comes from Sports England)
 - £ 2000 for improving wheelchair accessibility to the swing area
2. Provide students with a wide range of sporting activities in and outside the school
 - £ 475 for training one member of staff for Rebound therapy
 - £ 2940 for improving PE equipment for outdoor education
3. To work towards afPE Quality Mark for Physical Education and Sport

Impact:

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation. As a result of using Sports Premium effectively our provision has improved the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, developed outdoor areas, included increasing participation in PE and sport and leisure so that all pupils have developed healthy lifestyles and reached the performance levels they are capable of.
