### SPORTS PREMIUM 2018-19 IMPACT

#### Background

In order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools the government is providing additional funding for primary school sport. This funding is given directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium Funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

#### Allocation

For the academic year 2018 -19 received an amount of £16,000 sports premium.

#### Impact

1. To improve PE facilities at school.	£ 10000 Broken down into;  £3000 sensory trail £4000 soft play £3000 equipment	We purchased a range of larger bicycles, push bikes and scooters for the cycle track to be more accessible to a range of students. The sensory trail was completed as addition for our outdoor learning . The soft play room will be completed this Summer 2019 with extra equipment including a trampette and mangle.	As a result of purchasing specialist PE equipment the students have developed their physical skills being able to grow in confidence and achieve in new areas of their development e.g learning to ride a bicycle or reaching and grasping an object to access the sensory trail. The development of lunch time clubs, has widened participation in PE in aspects like wheelchair dance and broadened opportunities for more pupils to access.
2. To provide the students with a wide range of sports activities in school	£ 2000	The students have been able to access lunchtime clubs including a multi-skills club and in house clubs.	Students have had the opportunity to use community based sporting opportunities to further develop their skills and knowledge and in their ability to transition and manage their own behaviour in new environments. Due to staff training we have been able to maintain high quality PE provision and extend our PE offer and have provided a venue for other schools to be Sherborne
3. To provide the students with a wide range of sports activities in the community	£ 2000	KS1 and KS2 students went weekly to horse riding at Gaddesden Stables. Students participated in festivals and games set up by the SLD PE Coordinators. Students have been sailing on a weekly basis to Rickmansworth Aquadrome. Classes have accessed other community provisions e.g Rock Up, Jump Jump, Stanborough Cycles.	
4. To further develop staff skills and ensure the quality of provision.	£2000	Two members of staff were trained in Rebound Therapy and now support the Rebound After School Club. Two staff
