## SPORTS PREMIUM 2022-23 IMPACT

## Background

In order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools the government is providing additional funding for primary school sport. This funding is given directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium Funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

## Allocation

For the academic year 2022 -23 we expect to receive an amount of £16520 and have a carry forward allocation of £14000, totalling £30,520.

This new provision has been utilised by both schools to develop mobility, physical skills and social interaction
2. To provide the students with a wide range of sport activities at school	£2000	External PE specialist such as multi skill / games coaches, tennis coaching	opportunities. Pupils from Breakspeare has used the provision on a weekly basis. 2. Tennis sessions have increased hand / eye coordination and turn taking and given opportunities to PMLD classes to have access to a new sport with adapted equipment. 3. Horse riding has given opportunities again to ride horses for the first time, follow instructions, develop posture, and to learn to look after animals. Sailing has given more pupils a chance to begin to learn to steer and control their own boat with supervision. Pupils have learnt to ride adapted cycles and enjoy cycling with an adult in safe and controlled environment. 4. Three members of staff did the Rebound Training and are leading sessions

To develop the quality of physical equipment available for pupils, both indoors and outdoors	£6000 indoors (C/F from the previous year) £4020 outdoors	To develop the range of equipment / activities in the sensory circuit giving options to rotate equipment. To extend opportunities for outdoor physical equipment including trampolines, adapted bikes, outdoor mobiles that will stimulate PMLD pupils to be more physically active outside.	New sensory circuit equipment was purchased in form of indoor swing and squeeze machine. Outdoor equipment to support the play and regulation of pupils to have a physical outlet was purchased in form of trampolines, trikes and scooters.
6. To facilitate the transport of groups of pupils to venues safely and ensure there are fewer barriers to organising trips.	£2000	For the above trips to happen, it may be necessary to hire / loan an extra vehicle or pay for a driver for the day.	This has been used this year to facilitate a weekly trip to go sailing at Rickmansworth Aquadrome and visit Cassiobury Park.
