SPORTS PREMIUM 2023-24 IMPACT

Background

In order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools the government is providing additional funding for primary school sport. This funding is given directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium Funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

For the academic year 2023 -24 we expect to receive an amount of £16107.

To improve PE facilities at school	£8000	To purchase new equipment to enhance interactions in the soft play room and the gym between the two AS classrooms for sensory regulation. To purchase a couple of adapted trikes which will enable those with more physical barriers to access a bicycle with support.	1. Some new equipment purchased for sensory gym including squeeze machine for sensory regulation and new swing for sensory circuit. Two new specialised trikes purchased specifically for pupils to support their physical and mobility development.		
2. To provide the students with a wide range of sport activities at school	£2000	External PE specialist such as tennis coaching from Get Set 4 Tennis and yoga.	2. Tennis sessions have increased hand / eye coordination and turn taking and given opportunities to PMLD classes to have access to a new sport with adapted equipment.		
3. To provide the students with a wide range of sport activities in the community	£3,607	To provide pupils with increased opportunities to engage in off site visits for their physical development. This will include; Horse riding - Sailing at Rickmansworth Aquadrome Visits to other centres for physical development e.g. Rock up, Leavesden Country Park, Stanborough Lakes – for accessible bikes / boats	3. Horseriding has given opportunities again to ride horses for the first time, follow instructions, develop posture, and to learn to look after animals. Sailing has given more pupils a chance to begin to learn to steer and control their own boat with supervision. Pupils have learnt to ride adapted cycles and enjoy cycling with an adult in safe and controlled environment		



4. To further develop staff skills and ensure the quality of provision	£1500	- Rebound therapy training for members of staff to extend provision throughout school.	4. Two members of staff did the Rebound Training and are leading sessions with their class as part of their curriculum delivery.
5. To develop the quality of physical equipment available for pupils, both indoors and outdoors	£1000	For the above trips to happen, it may be necessary to hire / loan an extra vehicle or pay for a driver for the day.	5. Facilitated hiring a vehicle through the year to take pupils to Stanborough Lakes for cycling and to sailing at Rickmansworth.
