Background

In order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools the government is providing additional funding for primary school sport. This funding is given directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all children. All schools will be held accountable for how they have used the additional Sports Premium Funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport.

Allocation

For the academic year 2024 -25 we expect to receive an amount of £16000.

A large trampoline continues to provide outdoor leisure and supports sensory breaks and meets physical needs of AS pupils. Outdoor equipment for Holywell playground has included climbing frames, trampolines and an activity centre, providing opportunities for development of gross motor skills, balance and coordination.		
2. To provide the students with a wide range of sport activities at school	£2500	External PE specialist such as tennis coaching and multi sports.	Tennis sessions have increased hand / eye coordination and turn taking and given opportunities to classes to have access to this sport with adapted equipment.		
3. To provide the students with a wide range of sport activities in the community	£3,500	To provide pupils with increased opportunities to engage in off site visits for their physical development. This will include; Horse riding - Stanborough Lakes - cycling Visits to other centres for physical development e.g. Rock up, Leavesden Country Park	Horseriding has given opportunities again to ride horses for the first time, follow instructions, improve posture, and to learn to look after animals. Pupils have learnt to ride adapted cycles and enjoy cycling with an adult or have their wheelchair on a adapted bike in order to enjoy a ride in the countryside at speed in safe and controlled environment.		



4. To further develop staff skills and ensure the quality of provision	£1500	Rebound therapy training for up to 4 members of staff to extend provision throughout school.	Five members of staff did the Rebound Training and will support the delivery of Rebound to their classes as part of the curriculum delivery.
5. To facilitate the transport of groups of pupils to venues safely and ensure there are fewer barriers to organising trips.	£2000	For the above trips to happen, it may be necessary to hire / loan an extra vehicle or pay for a driver for the day.	This facilitated hiring a vehicle to take pupils to Stanborough Lakes for cycling.
